Heard from my attorney. Just so you know the background - he is my counterpart in MN and is also a practicing attorney with many years of experience in beer regulatory law. So he knows this situation intimately. He agrees with me that the sub. looks good - but we have one suggestion I'd like to pass along to Aaron. Feel free to forward this message directly to him.

Our goal with AB 787 is to regulate "direct shipping" from brewer-to-retailer so that any brewer wishing to do so has to follow the same set of rules and regulations as independent distributors, and in doing this "reciprocity" provision we want to maintain that as best we can.

One of the key provisions in AB 787 is what we call the "come to rest" provision which requires that beer be delivered to retailers only from a licensed wholesale warehouse (whether that warehouse is owned by an independent distributor or by a brewer). We cannot regulate behavior of MN companies in MN, but we can place minimum requirements on when "reciprocity" applies in Wisconsin.

Our suggestion would be to add some language in 125.29(1)(b) [which appears in the sub on page 2, lines 3-12]. We'd like to insert the following "and that further requires that all fermented malt beverages must be first unloaded at and distributed from the warehouse of the licensed wholesaler" - it would go right after the word "state" in line 6.

This would basically require then that reciprocity apply only with adjoining states who also have a "come to rest" provision - which MN does - and effectively regulate MN wholesalers without placing any restrictions on those wholesalers. Make sense?

With that change the Sub. is good to go - takes care of the problem in Superior, but does so in a way that works properly with the intent and effect of AB 787.

ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT,

TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 775

AN ACT to renumber and amend 125.28 (1); and to amend 125.30 (1) and 125.34 (2) (a) of the statutes; relating to: fermented malt beverages wholesalers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 125.28 (1) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act (Assembly Bill 787), is renumbered 125.28 (1) (a) and amended to read:

125.28 (1) (a) Every Subject to par. (b), every municipal governing body may issue licenses to wholesalers for the sale of fermented malt beverages from premises within the municipality, which premises shall comply with the requirements under s. 125.34 (2). Subject to s. 125.34, a wholesaler's license authorizes sales of fermented malt beverages only in original packages or containers to retailers or wholesalers, not to be consumed in or about the wholesaler's premises where sold. In the case of

a foreign corporation or foreign limited liability company whose wholesale premises is located outside of this state,.

(b) If a wholesaler does not maintain any warehouse in this state but is licensed and maintains a warehouse in an adjoining state that allows wholesalers licensed in this state to deliver fermented malt beverages to retailers in the adjoining state without warehousing in that state, the wholesaler's license shall be issued by the governing body of the municipality in which some part of the wholesaler's business is conducted in this state. Notwithstanding s. 125.04 (5) (a) 2. and (c) and (6), the municipal governing body may issue the wholesaler's license to a wholesaler described in this paragraph who is a natural person and not a resident of this state or that is a corporation or limited liability company and has not appointed an agent in this state.

- (c) No additional license or permit is required for the solicitation of orders for sale to or by licensed wholesalers.
- SECTION 2. 125.30 (1) of the statutes, as affected by 2005 Wisconsin Act (Assembly Bill 787), is amended to read:

125.30 (1) The department shall issue out-of-state shippers' permits which, except as provided in s. 125.34 (6) (c), authorize the permittee to ship fermented malt beverages only to holders of a wholesaler's license issued under s. 125.28. No Except with respect to any shipment from a warehouse in an adjoining state by a wholesaler issued a wholesale license under s. 125.28 (1) (b), no person may receive fermented malt beverages in this state which have been directly shipped from outside this state by any person other than the holder of a permit issued under this section. Subject to s. 125.34 (2) and (6) (c), all shipments of fermented malt beverages to a wholesaler of fermented malt beverages in this state, whether shipped to the wholesaler from

inside this state or from outside this state, shall be unloaded in and distributed from the wholesaler's warehouse in this state.

SECTION 3. 125.34 (2) (a) of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act (Assembly Bill 787), is amended to read:

125.34 (2) (a) No fermented malt beverages may be sold, transported, or delivered to a retailer unless, prior to such sale, transport, or delivery, the fermented malt beverages are first unloaded at and distributed from a wholesaler's warehouse premises covered by both a wholesaler's license issued under s. 125.28 and an alcohol beverage warehouse permit issued under s. 125.19, which premises shall be in this state and shall be a physically separate location from any retail premises or brewery premises. This paragraph does not apply to a wholesaler issued a wholesaler's license under s. 125.28 (1) (b) with respect to fermented malt beverages transported and delivered from a warehouse in an adjoining state unless the wholesaler's warehouse in the adjoining state is located on premises in the adjoining state used for the manufacture of fermented malt beverages.

SECTION 4. Initial applicability.

(1) This act first applies to fermented malt beverages wholesalers' licenses issued on the effective date of this subsection.
