# Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who wishes to receive an operator's license or identification card from the Department of Transportation (DOT) must provide certain information to DOT, including the person's name, address, date of birth, and physically descriptive information. A license or an identification card that is issued by DOT includes a picture of the person, identifying information, the person's signature, and physically descriptive information.

Under this bill, an applicant for an operator's license or identification card must present documentary proof that the person is either a United States citizen or legally present in the United States. The bill requires DOT to include on the person's operator's license or identification card the date on which the person's legal presence in the United States expires, and specifies that the person's license or identification card expires on that date. If the person is authorized to be in the United States for an unspecified period of time, the standard renewal periods for an operator's license or an identification card apply.

For administrative purposes, I would suggest two changes to the proposal:

#1: Since DOR has already sent out estimates of utility shared revenues for 2005, I would suggest that the proposal first affect utility aid payments made in July 2006. This would also permit DOR the time gather the necessary data -- especially if any existing wind farms would qualify.

- #2: I would suggest there be a specific date on which the revenues from an affected wind farm would become subject to the gross receipts tax. Perhaps something like the following could be added to section 2?
- (2) The treatemnt of section 76.28 (1) (gm) 2. takes effect on January 1,2006.

I used January 1, 2006, in case any existing wind facility could fall under the proposed change -- to permit them to adjust the amounts they charge their customers to reflect the tax change.



AN ACT to amend 343.50 (4), 343.50 (5) and 343.50 (6); and to create 343.06 (1)

(L), 343.14 (2) (er), 343.20 (1) (f) and 343.20 (1m) of the statutes; **relating to:** 

operator's licenses and identification cards for aliens.

# Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person who wishes to receive an operator's license or identification card from the Department of Transportation (DOT) must provide certain information to DOT, including the person's name, address, date of birth, and physically descriptive information. A license or an identification card that is issued by DOT includes a picture of the person, identifying information, the person's signature, and physically descriptive information.

Under this substitute amendment, an applicant for an operator's license or identification card must present documentary proof that the person is either a United States citizen or legally present in the United States. The substitute amendment requires DOT to include on the person's operator's license or identification card the date on which the person's legal presence in the United States expires, and specifies that the person's license or identification card expires on that date. If the person is authorized to be in the United States for an unspecified period

of time, the standard renewal periods for an operator's license or an identification card apply.
