- 1 AN ACT *to amend* 346.91 of the statutes; **relating to:** crossing a fire hose that
- 2 is being used in an emergency situation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no person may drive a vehicle over an unprotected fire hose that is laid down to be used at any fire or alarm of fire emergency. A person who does so may be required to forfeit not less than \$20 nor more than \$40 for the first offense and not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 for a second or subsequent violation within one year.

This bill prohibits a person from driving a vehicle over an unprotected fire hose that is laid down to be used at any training exercise, scene of an emergency, or alarm of emergency. The same penalties apply to a person who violates this prohibition.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 346.91 of the statutes is amended to read:
