Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would require all bidders for contracts to perform work on a public works project, other than a state highway project, that is subject to the prevailing wage law, to submit with the bid a statement that the bidder and their subcontractors have in place, or will have in place before work commences, a drug and alcohol testing program that complies with this bill.

State Effect:

The Department will need to ensure that all bid packages include the form adopted by the department of workforce development. While this would be one more step in reviewing the bid, it would not be a significant workload to require additional funding. However, the lack of the form or a testing program could be a deciding factor in the award of a contract if the bidder failed to provide either the testing program or the documentation required.

Local Effect:

Same as the state. It is not possible to determine if the local agencies would have costs as a result of this bill.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

None anticipated at this time.
