Representative Gundrum:

An interstate compact is a contract between the compacting states. In order for a contract to be valid and binding, there must be a meeting of the minds between the contracting parties, that is, all of the parties must agree to the same thing. Accordingly, if this amendment is adopted by this state, a similar amendment will also have to be adopted by all of the other states that are parties to the compact in order for the compact to be valid and binding.
