ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 218

May 17, 2005 – Offered by Representative HINES.

1 AN ACT *to amend* 453.05 (2) (b) of the statutes; **relating to:** castrating certain animals.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a person may castrate a dog, cat, horse, pig, goat, sheep, or head of cattle without obtaining a veterinary license. Under this substitute amendment, a person may castrate certain livestock, including bovine animals, sheep, goats, swine, farm–raised deer, and equine animals, without obtaining a veterinary license.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 453.05 (2) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 453.05 **(2)** (b) Castrating male dogs, cats, horses, pigs, goats, sheep or cattle
- 5 <u>livestock, as defined in s. 95.68 (1) (d)</u> or for dehorning or branding animals.
