Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

This bill would allow nonresident full-time students attending a college in this state that offers an associate degree to purchase resident fishing, small game hunting or deer hunting licenses. Current law allows nonresident fulltime students attending a college that offers a bachelor degree this privilege.

Fiscal Estimate:

For the 2005 license year, approximately 800 nonresidents qualified for the resident rates based on attending a school with a bachelor degree. It's logical to assume that a similar number of students attending a school offering an associate degree will take advantage of this law change. However, it may also create new sales to some who did not purchase any privileges in the past since they did not qualify for the resident rates.
