Under current law, religious, charitable, service, fraternal, and veterans' organizations and organizations to which contributions are deductible for federal income tax purposes may operate bingo games upon obtaining a state bingo license. The maximum allowable monetary prize for any single bingo game is \$250, and the maximum allowable monetary prize for a single bingo occasion is \$1,000. These maximums do not apply to bingo games operated by a senior citizen community center, adult family home, or community-based residential facility. This bill increases the maximum allowable prize per game to \$500, and the maximum allowable prize per bingo occasion to \$2,500.

Michigan Progressive Jackpot Bingo Game

BACKGROUND

Act 382 of the Public Acts of 1972 was amended to allow organizations to conduct a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game in conjunction with a licensed large bingo occasion. The jackpot prizes and the consolation prizes awarded through the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game are not subject to the \$500 per game and \$2,000 per occasion prize limitations as stated in section 3a (3) of the act.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Only one Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall be conducted at a bingo occasion.
2. The Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall only be played on disposable bingo cards which shall be a color or design the licensee does not use in any other game.
3. All bingo cards sold for the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall be sold at a uniform price. There shall be no discount for the purchase of more than one card (this includes books, pads, packets, or other combinations of cards offered for sale). For example, if a 3-on sheet is sold for \$1.50, a 6-on sheet shall be sold for \$3.00. A card is considered to be one face. Therefore, a 6-on sheet contains six cards.

Note: The disposable bingo cards for the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall not be sold as part of a book if the licensee offers a discount for the purchase of more than one book.

4. All bingo cards used in the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall be sold prior to the drawing of the first ball for that game.
5. The Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game is a COVERALL ONLY. No other combinations will be allowed.
6. The Michigan progressive jackpot prize shall be paid by check. The consolation prize may be paid by cash or check.
7. The consolation prize shall not be paid from the 50% of the card sales used to fund the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game.

GAME CONDUCT

8. On the first bingo occasion of a progression, an organization shall establish the maximum number of calls needed to win the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game. The maximum number of calls at the start of a progression shall not be less than 50. The number of

allowable calls shall increase by one on each successive bingo occasion in a particular progression until the jackpot prize is awarded.

9. If a player does not bingo in the number of allowable calls for that occasion, the coverall game shall continue until a consolation prize is awarded.
10. Once a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game has been started, the Michigan progressive jackpot prize shall be offered at each successive bingo occasion for that license until the jackpot prize is won.

Note: If an organization's bingo license will expire and is not renewed, or is suspended, revoked, or surrendered before the jackpot prize has been awarded, the winner shall be determined and the jackpot prize shall be awarded on the last authorized bingo occasion regardless of the number of calls needed to determine a winner.

11. A disputed Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall be resolved in accordance with **R 432.21324.**

PRIZE AMOUNTS

12. The starting jackpot for each Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game is either:
 - (a) 50% of the card sales for the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game for that occasion, or
 - (b) An amount predetermined by each individual organization. This predetermined amount for the first game of the jackpot progression shall not exceed \$500.00.
13. On each succeeding occasion, the jackpot prize is the entire amount of the preceding occasion's jackpot plus 50% of the card sales for the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game for the current bingo occasion.
14. Each organization shall set an amount to be awarded as a consolation prize. The consolation prize shall be a predetermined amount that does not exceed \$100.00 per occasion. If the jackpot prize is won, no consolation prize shall be awarded.

POSTING AND ANNOUNCING

15. Prior to the start of the bingo occasion, the licensee shall post a notice with the following information:
 - a. The maximum number of allowable calls in which the player must complete a coverall pattern in order to win the Michigan progressive bingo game jackpot prize for that occasion.
 - b. The prior week's Michigan progressive bingo game jackpot prize.
 - c. The amount of the consolation prize.
 - d. The date the next bingo occasion will occur in that particular progression if the jackpot is not awarded.
 - e. The color or design of the bingo card used in the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game.

16. Prior to the start of the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game, the licensee shall announce the following information:
- a. The maximum number of allowable calls in which the player must complete a coverall pattern in order to win the Michigan progressive bingo game jackpot prize for that occasion.
 - b. The prize amount of the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game for that occasion.
 - c. The amount of the consolation prize.

The prize for a bingo game must be determined and awarded on the same day the game is played. Additionally, the prize for a bingo game cannot be determined on the basis of a specified number of calls.

NOA **Ins 2:**
The bill also allows organizations that have a bingo license to conduct progressive jackpot bingo. In progressive jackpot bingo, the prize is carried over to a succeeding game if no player wins in a specified number of calls, and a player must cover all the squares on his or her bingo card to win. Should the bill require that the price of a card for progressive jackpot bingo remain the same over successive bingo occasions until someone wins the progressive jackpot?

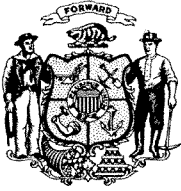

Brian, I need to get drafting instructions from Sen. Lazich, so I am carbon copying Carole Schaeffer from the Senator's office on this e-mail.

Under the bill, the initial jackpot can be a fixed amount, it's just the roll-over jackpots that are based in part on card sales. I can change the bill so the roll-over jackpot can be either the previous jackpot plus 50% of card sales or the previous amount plus an additional amount specified by the bingo operator before the game starts (the bill can include a maximum or minimum dollar value for the additional amount.) I can also change the language in the bill for the consolation prize. Basically, the bill can make whatever rules for prize amounts that the group wants, or can be silent on prize amounts. I just need to make sure that I make an exception to the prize posting provision in 563.51 (23) if the prize amount can't be determined prior to the game. (I think I need such an exception in the current version of the bill for situations where the prize amount is based on card sales).

We, and the Senators constituents, are having a problem with the new legislation where the progressive game prizes are percentages versus real dollar figures. Bingo (and raffles) have always had the exact prize known to a purchaser at the time the cards or tickets are purchased. I heard the concern from Al from WI Bingo Supply (the group spokesperson) and he also talked about how the \$100 consolation prize might not be swell enough to lure players. I suggested making it a minimum instead of the maximum and let the market drive the prize. He liked that notion.

563.51(23) covers the prize posting/announcement issue. Any ideas?

The prize for a bingo game must be determined and awarded on the same day the game is played. Additionally, the prize for a bingo game may not be based on the number of calls made before a player wins. This bill increases the maximum allowable prize for a single bingo game to \$500, and the maximum allowable prize for a bingo occasion to \$2,500. The bill also allows organizations that have a bingo license to conduct progressive jackpot bingo. Currently, the Department of Administration (DOA) offers two types of licenses to conduct bingo: a regular license and a limited period license. An organization with a regular license may conduct "regular" bingo games. Regular bingo games must be played on reusable cards (hard cards). For an admission fee not to exceed \$1, a player receives a hard card that he or she may use to play all regular bingo games conducted at a session of bingo. For each regular game a person may rent extra hard cards at a cost not to exceed \$1 per extra card per game. Current law does not limit the number of regular bingo sessions that a regular bingo licensee may conduct in a year.

An organization with a regular license may also conduct up to three games of "special" bingo at each session of regular bingo. Special bingo is played on disposable (paper) cards.
