Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The State Public Defender (SPD) provides legal representation in criminal cases and other specified proceedings in which the loss of personal liberty or parental rights may occur. For adult clients, the SPD must complete a financial eligibility evaluation before appointing an attorney. SPD services are constitutionally required because in the case types handled by SPD, a defendant without the financial means to hire an attorney has the right to have an attorney appointed. Therefore, any bill that would increase the number of cases handled by SPD would increase SPD costs.

Although this bill does not create an entirely new criminal offense for which SPD will be required to appoint attorneys, it substantially increases the penalties. Thus, SPD is likely to see increased costs from increased attorney time related to the bill's requirement of mandatory life imprisonment. The mandatory imprisonment provision is likely to result in more trials.

Counties are likely to incur additional costs for incarceration of defendants held in jail pending court hearings. For the same reason that we can anticipate more trials, we can anticipate a longer average time between initial charge and disposition of the case.

In FY 2005, the SPD appointed counsel in 85 cases in which the defendant was charged with first-degree sexual assault. We do not have data available on the number of these defendants who had previous convictions for the same offense and thus would have been subject to the provisions of this bill.

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates a penalty of life in prison without the possibility of parole or extended supervision, if a person is convicted of first degree sexual assault for a second time, against a person who was not a previous victim from a prior conviction(s) for first degree sexual assault.

Since 1990, approximately 8% of the offenders admitted to prison for conviction of first degree sexual assault had a prior conviction for first degree sexual assault. In CY04, 21 offenders were admitted to prison with a conviction for first degree sexual assault and 4 offenders were placed on probation. Assuming that approximately 8% of the offenders admitted to prison in a calendar year for first degree sexual assault have a prior conviction for that crime, it is estimated that 1-2 offenders in a given year may be affected by this legislation. It is assumed that the probationers do not have a prior conviction for first degree sexual assault.

We are unable to predict the precise fiscal impact on the Department because it is dependent on the following variables; 1) whether the District Attorney's office charges an offender under this enhanced penalty and 2) our data system cannot determine whether the current victim was a prior victim.

It is not anticipated that the bill will have a fiscal impact on county jails.

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2005 BILL

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AN ACT to renumber and amend 939.623 (2); and to create 939.623 (2) (b) of

the statutes; **relating to:** lifetime imprisonment for certain sex offenders and providing a penalty. $\sqrt{}$

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, if a person has one or more prior convictions for first-degree sexual assault and is subsequently convicted of first-degree sexual assault, the court must impose a bifurcated sentence (a sentence that consists of a term of confinement in prison and a term of extended supervision) and may not place the defendant on probation. The total length of the bifurcated sentence, not including any applicable penalty enhancements, may not exceed 60 years.

This bill changes the penalty if the person has one or more prior convictions for first degree sexual assault or the equivalent in any jurisdiction and is subsequently convicted of first degree sexual assault against a person who was not the victim of one of the person's previous convictions for first degree sexual assault. In that case, the court must impose a life sentence on the person without parole or extended supervision.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report concerning the proposed penalty and the costs or savings that are likely to result if the bill is enacted.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 939.623 (2) of the statutes is renumbered 939.623 (2) (a) and amended to read:

939.623 (2) (a) If Except as provided in par. (b), if a person has one or more prior convictions for a serious sex crime and subsequently commits a serious sex crime, the court shall impose a bifurcated sentence under s. 973.01. The term of confinement in prison portion of a bifurcated sentence imposed under this subsection may not be less than 3 years and 6 months, but otherwise the penalties for the crime apply, subject to any applicable penalty enhancement. The court may not place the defendant on probation.

Section 2. 939.623 (2) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

939.623 (2) (b) If a person has one or more prior convictions for a violation of s. 940.225 (1) or for a comparable crime under federal law or the law of any state and subsequently is convicted of a violation of s. 940.225 (1) against a person who was not a victim of one of the prior convictions or comparable crimes committed by the person, the term of imprisonment for the violation of s. 940.225 (1) is life imprisonment without the possibility of parole or extended supervision.

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ASSEMBLY BILL

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SECTION 2. 939.623 (2) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

939.623 (2) (b) If a person has one or more prior convictions for a violation of s. 940.225 (1) or for a comparable crime under federal law or the law of any state and subsequently is convicted of a violation of s. 940.225 (1) against a person who was not a victim of one of the prior convictions or comparable crimes committed by the person, the maximum term of imprisonment for the violation of s. 940.225 (1) is life imprisonment without the possibility of parole or extended supervision.
