## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 343.07 (7) of the statutes is created to read:
- 5 343.07 (7) Penalty for restriction violations. (a) Notwithstanding s. 343.43
- 6 (1) (d) and (3m), any person who violates sub. (1) (a), (bm), or (d) or (4) (b) 1. or 2. shall
- 7 be required to forfeit \$50 for the first offense and not less than \$50 nor more than
- 8 \$100 for each subsequent offense.
- 9 (b) Upon receiving notice of a person's conviction for a violation of sub. (1) (a),
- (bm), or (d) or (4) (b) 1. or 2., the department shall notify any adult sponsor who has
- signed for the person under s. 343.15 (1) of the conviction.
