Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill expands the list of felonies that can be considered and lead to a charge of felony murder. Under current law, a person may be charged with felony murder if he or she commits, or attempts to commit, one of six specified felonies, and causes the death of another person while committing or attempting to commit that crime.

It is impossible to predict how many such crimes will be filed in the circuit court. Felony proceedings generally require additional court appearances and more court hearings than misdemeanors and are more likely to result in trials. The felonies to which felony murder charges may be added are among the most serious crimes and often require more time and a disproportionate amount of court resources for the number of proceedings brought. The increased penalties may also lead more persons to challenge the underlying charges.

Additional proceedings require additional judge, court reporter, court staff and juror time. These costs are borne by both the state and the county. An accurate estimate of the additional costs is impossible with the data available.
