

2005 SENATE BILL 414

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 36.27 (3m) (b) 1. and 2. and 38.24 (5) (b) 1. and 2. of the statutes;
2 **relating to:** fee remission for children and surviving spouses of ambulance
3 drivers, correctional officers, emergency medical services technicians, fire
4 fighters, and law enforcement officers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

5 **SECTION 1.** 36.27 (3m) (b) 1. and 2. of the statutes are amended to read:
6 36.27 **(3m)** (b) 1. The child of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, fire
7 fighter, emergency medical services technician or law enforcement officer who was
8 killed in the line of duty in this state or who qualified for a duty disability benefit,
9 as defined in s. 40.65 (4), under the Wisconsin Retirement System, the Employees'
10 Retirement System of the city of Milwaukee, or the Milwaukee County Employee's

1 Retirement System and died as a result of the qualifying disability. The student
2 must be the child of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, fire fighter, emergency
3 medical services technician or law enforcement officer who was so killed or who died
4 as a result of the qualifying disability when the child was under the age of 21 or before
5 the child was born.

6 2. The surviving spouse of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, fire fighter,
7 emergency medical services technician or law enforcement officer who was killed in
8 the line of duty in this state or who qualified for a duty disability benefit, as defined
9 in s. 40.65 (4), under the Wisconsin Retirement System, the Employees' Retirement
10 System of the city of Milwaukee, or the Milwaukee County Employee's Retirement
11 System and died as a result of the qualifying disability.

12 **SECTION 2.** 38.24 (5) (b) 1. and 2. of the statutes are amended to read:

13 38.24 (5) (b) 1. The child of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, fire
14 fighter, emergency medical services technician or law enforcement officer who was
15 killed in the line of duty in this state or who qualified for a duty disability benefit
16 under s. 40.65 (4), under the Wisconsin Retirement System, the Employees'
17 Retirement System of the city of Milwaukee, or the Milwaukee County Employee's
18 Retirement System and died as a result of the qualifying disability. The student
19 must be the child of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, fire fighter, emergency
20 medical services technician or law enforcement officer who was so killed or who died
21 as a result of the qualifying disability when the child was under the age of 21 or before
22 the child was born.

23 2. The surviving spouse of an ambulance driver, correctional officer, fire fighter,
24 emergency medical services technician or law enforcement officer who was killed in
25 the line of duty in this state or who qualified for a duty disability benefit, as defined

4 **SECTION 3. Initial applicability.**

5 (1) This act first applies to fee remissions for persons registered for or enrolled
6 in the academic semester that begins after the effective date of this subsection.
