✓ SENATE ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1,

TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 64 ✓

February 22, 2005 - Offered by Representatives VRUWINK, ZIEGELBAUER, GRONEMUS, NELSON, SHERMAN and HUBLER.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 ✓ 1. Page 1, line 4: delete lines 4 and 5.

3 ✓ 2. Page 2, line 1: delete lines 1 to 4 and substitute:

4 "SECTION 1g. 6.78 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

5 6.78 (1) In all 1st, 2nd, and 3rd class cities, and in 4th class cities, villages, and  
6 towns having a population of more than ~~2,000~~<sup>2,500</sup>, from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.

7 SECTION 1r. 6.78 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

8 6.78 (2) In 4th class cities, villages and towns having a population of ~~2,000~~<sup>2,500</sup> or  
9 less, from 9 a.m. until 8 p.m.; extendable by the governing body to not earlier than  
10 7 a.m. Notice of the change of hours shall be given by publication in a newspaper,  
11 under ch. 985, once each week for 2 successive weeks, with the first insertion not less  
12 than 8 days before the election. The new hours shall take effect only after the notice

1 provisions have been complied with. When the ordinance applies to all future  
2 elections, notice need be given only for the first election affected by the change.”.

3 √ **3.** Page 2, line 12: delete “~~set the election hours and~~” and substitute “set the  
4 election hours and”.

5 √ **4.** Page 2, line 13: after “provided in” insert “this paragraph and”.

6 √ **5.** Page 2, line 17: delete the material beginning with “~~Election~~” and ending  
7 with “~~7 a.m.~~” on line 21 and substitute “Election hours set by the governing body of  
8 the special purpose district for each polling place shall be the same as those provided  
9 by law or by the governing body of the municipality in which the polling place is  
10 located, except that if the opening hour is later than 7 a.m., the governing body of the  
11 special purpose district may extend the opening hour to not earlier than 7 a.m.”.

12 ↓ **6.** Page 3, line 7: delete “~~set the election hours and~~” and substitute “set the  
13 election hours and”.

14 ↓ **7.** Page 3, line 9: delete the material beginning with “~~Election~~” and ending  
15 with “~~7 a.m.~~” on line 12 and substitute “Election hours set by the school board shall  
16 be the same as those provided by law or by the municipal governing body in which  
17 the polling place is located, except that if the opening hour is later than 7 a.m., the  
18 school board may extend the opening hour to not earlier than 7 a.m.”.
