Section #. 254.61 (5) of the statutes is amended to read:

- 254.61 (5) "Restaurant" means any building, room or place where meals are prepared or served or sold to transients or the general public, and all places used in connection with it and includes any public or private school lunchroom for which food service is provided by contract. "Meals" does not include soft drinks, ice cream, milk, milk drinks, ices and confections. "Restaurant" does not include:
- (a) Taverns that serve free lunches consisting of popcorn, cheese, crackers, pretzels, cold sausage, cured fish or bread and butter.
- (b) Churches, religious, fraternal, youths' or patriotic organizations, service clubs and civic organizations which occasionally prepare, serve or sell meals to transients or the general public.
- (c) Any public or private school lunchroom for which food service is directly provided by the school, or a private individual selling foods from a movable or temporary stand at public farm sales.
 - (d) Any bed and breakfast establishment that serves breakfasts only to its lodgers.
 - (e) The serving of food or beverage through a licensed vending machine.
- (f) Any college campus, as defined in s. 36.05 (6m), institution as defined in s. 36.51 (1) (b) or technical college that serves meals only to the students enrolled in the college campus, institution or school or to authorized elderly persons under s. 36.51 or 38.36.
- (g) A concession stand at a locally sponsored sporting event, such as a little league game.

Legislative Intent:

Exempt potlucks from all food safety and licensure rules of HFS and DATCP

Potluck under this section shall be defined as:

(1) An event that is free of charge that the attendees bring food and beverages to be shared that is prepared and served at no charge to attendees; (2) there is no compensation provided to those conducting or assisting the event nor anyone providing food and beverages for the event; (3) and the event is sponsored by churches, religious, fraternal, youth's or patriotic organizations, service clubs and civic organizations, taverns, parent-teacher organizations, senior citizen centers and organizations, and adult daycare centers.

regulation of restaurants.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law relating to public health, the Department of Health and Family Services and local health departments annually issue permits to and otherwise regulate restaurants. A "restaurant" is defined to mean any building, room, or place where meals are prepared, served, or sold to transients or the general The definition has numerous exceptions, including free lunches from taverns; occasional meals prepared, served, or sold by churches, certain organizations, and service clubs; public or private school lunchrooms; stands at public farm sales; and licensed vending machines.

This bill expands the exceptions to the definition of "restaurant" under the public health laws to include potluck events, as defined in the bill.

For further information see the state and local fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 254.61 (3m) of the statutes is created to read:

254.61 (3m) "Pot luck event" means an event to which all of the following apply:

(a) Attendees of the event provide food and beverages to be shared with other
attendees and consumed at the event.
(b) No compensation is provided to any person who conducts or assists in
providing the event or who provides food and beverages to be shared at the event, and
no compensation is paid by any person for consumption of food or beverages at the
event.
(c) The event is sponsored by a church; religious, fraternal, youth, or patriotic
organization or service club; civic organization; tavern; parent-teacher
