We spoke late last week about the problems we have with AB 300. We still need to remove the the requirement for axle separation as we did in AB 300. However as we discussed there still is a problem with measurement of kingpin to axle in the statute. We would like to redraft the bill to make it an agricultural exemption addressing similar language in AB 300 and excluding these trailers from the 43 foot requirement provided they have at least two rear axles.

I think this would be the best way to go about it unless you have any other suggestions. The sooner we can get this done the better. Let me know if you have any questions or concerns. Thanks.
