Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

The DNR currently has the authority to sell seized and confiscated skins of furbearing animals, including those that are prepared as part of the course of instruction under the trapper education program. This bill will allow the proceeds of these sales to be credited to an appropriation to provide funding for the trapper education program, instead of being credited to the school fund. This bill will also authorize the DNR to receive and use unclaimed property that is in DNR's possession and property and weapons that have been seized or confiscated as a result of violations of certain laws, including fish and game laws and the trespass law. The DNR may then use the property for DNR's educational programs relating to hunting, fishing, trapping, and other conservation activities. The bill also gives DNR general authority to allow the resale of confiscated fish and game.

Fiscal Estimate:

Having the ability to use seized and confiscated items for educational programs may result in some cost savings to the DNR which would otherwise have to purchase such items, if needed. Based on average spending in previous years, it is estimated that allowing DNR to retain seized or confiscated property for its education programs will save approximately \$4,000 annually which would normally be spent to procure those items. Based on average sales in previous years, it is estimated that by allowing the DNR to sell skins of furbearing animals that \$8,000 in revenue will be generated annually for the trapper education program, instead of being deposited into the school fund.

There is no fiscal impact related to resale of confiscated fish and game.
