As passed by the 74th Texas Legislature

Sec. 28.004. HUMAN SEXUALITY INSTRUCTION. (a) Any course materials and instruction relating to human sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, or human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome shall be selected by the board of trustees of a school district with the advice of the local health education advisory council established under Subsection (e) and must

(1) present abstinence from sexual activity as the preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity for unmarried persons of school age:

(2) devote more attention to abstinence from sexual activity than to any other behavior;

(3) emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity, if used consistently and correctly, is the only method that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, infection with human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional trauma associated with adolescent sexual activity;

(4) direct adolescents to a standard of behavior in which abstinence from sexual activity

before marriage is the most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and infection with human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome; and

(5) teach contraception and condom use in terms of human use reality rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates, if instruction on contraception and condoms is included in curriculum content.

(b) A school district may not distribute condoms in connection with instruction relating to human sexuality.

(c) A school district that provides human sexuality instruction may separate students according to sex for instructional purposes.

- (d) The board of trustees of a school district shall determine the specific content of the district's instruction in human sexuality, in accordance with Subsections (a)-(c). A change in health curriculum content or instruction may not be made before considering the recommendations of the local health education advisory council.
- (e) A school district shall establish a local health education advisory council to assist the district in ensuring that local community values and health issues are reflected in the district's human sexuality instruction.
 - (f) The council's duties include:

(1) recommending appropriate grade levels for human sexuality instruction;

(2) recommending the methods of instruction to be used by a teacher in human sexuality instruction education; and

(3) recommending the number of hours of instruction to be provided in health education.

(g) The council:

(1) must include persons who represent diverse views in the community about human sexuality instruction;

(2) must include parents of students enrolled in the district as a majority of the council; and

(3) may include teachers, school administrators, students, health care professionals, members of the business community, law enforcement representatives, senior citizens, clergy, or other interested persons.

(h) A school district shall notify a parent of each student enrolled in the district of:

- the basic content of the district's human sexuality instruction to be provided to the student;
 and
 - (2) the parent's right to remove the student

from any part of the district's human sexuality instruction.

(i) A school district shall make all curriculum materials used in the district's human sexuality instruction available for reasonable public inspection.

Jim -

The Texas law you cited requires each school district to establish a local health education advisory council, which must include persons with diverse views about human sexuality instruction. A majority of the council members must be parents of students enrolled in the school district.

All course materials and instruction related to human sexuality, STD's, or AIDS must be selected by the school board with the advice of the local health education advisory council and must present abstinence from sexual activity as the preferred choice of behavior for unmarried persons of school age. The law requires that the materials and instruction devote more attention to abstinence than to any other behavior and emphasize that abstinence is the only method that is 100% effective in preventing pregnancy, STD's, and infection with AIDS.

The Texas law requires a school district to notify the parent of each student enrolled in the district of the basic content of its human sexuality instruction and the parent's right to remove his or her child from any part of the human sexuality instruction. The law also directs a school district to make all materials used in the human sexuality instruction available for public inspection. Finally, the Texas law prohibits a school district from distributing condoms.

Jim -

1999 LRB-0069/4 appropriates \$850,000 per year from federal TANF (temporary assistance to needy persons) funds to DPI and directs DPI to award grants to school districts and cooperative educational service agencies for the purpose of improving human growth and development programs that are designed to prevent pregnancy.

1999 AB 493 is broader in purpose as well as more detailed. The bill creates a prevention coordinating council in DHFS and appropriates \$800,000 GPR per year to DHFS for prevention planning grants. "Prevention planning" is defined to mean programs whose primary purpose is to provide children and families with the skills and resources necessary to address stressful conditions and avoid harmful behaviors. Counties, cities, villages, and towns are eligible for the grants.

I have not yet had a chance to look at the Texas law. As soon as I do, I'll let you know.

AN ACT to amend 118.019 (1), 118.019 (2) (a), 118.019 (2) (b), 118.019 (2) (c), 118.019 (2) (e), 118.019 (2) (f), 118.019 (2m) and 118.019 (3); and to create 118.019 (2) (g) of the statutes; relating to: school district human growth and development programs.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a school board may provide an instructional program in human growth and development in grades kindergarten to 12. The program may include instruction in a number of areas, including self-esteem, interpersonal relationships, human sexuality, family life, and sex stereotypes. This bill makes several changes in these areas, including the following:

1. Currently, a school board may include instruction in the discouragement of adolescent sexual activity. This bill provides instead that a school board may include medically accurate instruction in the social, psychological, and health benefits of abstaining from sexual activity.

2. Current law authorizes a school board to include instruction in human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome. This bill authorizes a school board to include instruction in all sexually transmitted diseases. In addition, all instruction relating to human sexuality, reproduction, sexually transmitted diseases, and childbirth must be medically accurate.

3. The bill authorizes instruction relating to sexual exploitation, acquaintance rape, and the legal consequences of sexual contact with a minor.

development programs.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a school board may provide an instructional program in human growth and development in grades kindergarten to 12. The program may include instruction in a number of areas, including self—esteem, interpersonal relationships, human sexuality, family life, and sex stereotypes. This bill provides that, if a school board provides instruction in human sexuality, reproduction, or family planning, it must ensure that all course materials and instruction do all of the following:

- 1. Present abstinence from sexual activity as the preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity for unmarried pupils.
- 2. Devote more attention to abstinence from sexual activity than to any other behavior.
- 3. Emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity before marriage is the most effective way to prevent pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.
- 4. If the curriculum includes instruction on the effectiveness of contraception or condoms, use actual effective rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates.
