Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill makes several changes regarding identification cards for disabled parking privileges (disabled ID card).

Disabled ID cards are issued to a "person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk." Statute defines a "person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk" as one of six conditions which are specified in the federal Americans with Disabilities Act, plus a seventh condition which is "a degree of disability equal to" the six enumerated conditions. This bill repeals that seventh condition, leaving the six that are specified in federal law.

The bill mandates that the Department of Transportation may issue only one card to a person unless the applicant requests a second card. Federal law requires states to issue two cards to a person if the person requests it. The bill directs DOT to provide by rule for issuance of replacement cards in case of lost or destroyed cards.

The bill increases the forfeiture for three current violations that represent fraudulent use of the disabled ID card. The bill creates two new violations for knowingly providing false information on (1) an application for disabled ID card, or on (2) the health care provider statement submitted in support of the application for disabled ID card.

No fiscal effect on the Department of Transportation or on the Transportation Fund.

Local fiscal impact is indeterminate. Both the local revenue generated from forfeitures and the local cost to enforce the law depend on how many citations would be issued for violations. DOT cannot estimate this impact.
