Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

AB 1060 contains provisions defining and affecting the residency requirements, operations, location, and funding of virtual charter schools.

AB 1060 pertains only to educational entities operating a virtual charter school.

The proposal would not expand technical college district or the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) authority to establish or operate a charter school or virtual charter school.

Under current law, the only technical college district in Wisconsin that is eligible to establish a charter school is the Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC). MATC has never established or operated a charter school or a virtual charter school and has not indicated to the State Board that it has plans to do so.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

There are no long-range fiscal implications of the proposed legislation on the WTCS.
