<b>Description</b> Authorizing a property owner to have his or her name removed from a governmental Internet listing of property taxes assessed									

## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a taxation district (a town, village, or city) may maintain an Internet listing of property owners within their jurisdiction and the property taxes assessed against the property. Counties may also maintain a similar listing.

Under the bill, upon a property owner's request, the taxation district must remove the taxpayer's name from the Internet listing. The taxation district must also allow property owners to directly remove their names from the Internet listing.

Requiring that a property owner's name be removed from an Internet listing upon request will increase municipal administrative costs. Requiring property owners to have the ability to directly remove their names from an Internet listing could require some type of security software to prevent improperly authorized name removals, which also increases administrative costs. However, some municipalities already provide mechanisms for property owners to have their names removed from their Internet listing of property owners. Since the Department of Revenue does not have information on how many municipalities maintain an Internet listing of property owners or how many permit property owners to request their names be removed, it is not possible to reasonably estimate the increase in municipal costs this bill would engender.

The bill does not affect Internet listings of property owners or tax bills maintained by counties. The bill therefore creates no costs for counties.
