Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill modifies fencing requirements for farm-raised deer farms that straddle a state border. It allows for the DNR to issue them a fencing certificate if the portion of the fence in Wisconsin meets the appropriate fencing requirements as determined by the DNR. These farms will also need to comply with all Wisconsin animal health rules and test all farm-raised deer that dies for chronic wasting disease, whether in this state or the other state.

This will allow the Department of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection (the department) to issue the deer farm a farm-raised deer registration. The disease monitoring will not add a workload burden to the department. The bill will have no fiscal impact on the department
