Subject Resident hunting and fishing licenses for nonresident children of residents		

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Bill Summary:

This bill would allow a nonresident minor child of a resident to pay the same fee as a resident when purchasing hunting and fishing approvals.

Fiscal Estimate:

At the present time it is not possible to determine the number of minors that would be affected. The number is anticipated to be relatively small, and any revenue impact should be minimal. It is possible that the provisions of the bill could lead to an increase in sale of resident hunting and fishing licenses. At the present time, the Nonresident Junior Sports and Nonresident Junior Conservation Patron license fees are the same as the resident license fees, so there would be no additional impact on these sales.

There will be no costs associated with implementing this bill. DNR would need to notify license agents of the new identification requirements.
