Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law a person is prohibited from intentionally confining or restraining another person without the other person's consent. Conviction of this offense is a felony that can result in a term of imprisonment of up to six years (maximum of 3 years confinement and 3 years extended supervision).

This bill prohibits human trafficking, defined as transporting, soliciting, recruiting, harboring, providing or obtaining another person for profit. It also prohibits a person from using people for forced labor or services, from knowingly benefiting from human trafficking or forced labor or services. Penalties under this bill would carry a term of imprisonment of up to 10 years (maximum of 5 years confinement and 5 years extended supervision).

The Department is unable to project the number of offenders who would receive a sentence under this new provision and is therefore unable to estimate the fiscal impact on state or local government. The FY04 annual cost to place an inmate in a DOC institution is approximately \$28,000 and \$2,000 for a community supervision placement.

A local impact will occur if an offender is sentenced to a jail term under the provisions in this bill, the extent of which is unknown.
