Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

It is impossible to determine the fiscal impact of this proposed legislation. Neither the Department of Public Instruction nor the individual school districts has estimates of the number of non-legal residents in the public schools in Wisconsin. Under Plyler v. Doe, public schools and their personnel are prohibited from: requiring students or parents to disclose or document their immigration status; making inquiries of students or parents which may expose their undocumented status; or requiring social security numbers of all students, as it may expose the undocumented status of students or parents.

In addition, even if it were possible to determine the number of non-legal residents attending Wisconsin high schools, and who would meet the other criteria of this proposed legislation, it would be impossible to ascertain the number of these individuals who would apply and be accepted to UW System institutions.
