Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits a person who knowingly is infected with HIV, AIDS or a sexually transmitted disease from intentionally having sexual intercourse with another person and not disclosing to the other person that they are infected with HIV, AIDS or a sexually transmitted disease. A person who is convicted under this new provision is guilty of a Class F felony (max of 7.5 years confinement time and 5 years extended supervision). This new penalty provision also requires a person who is convicted of this offense to register as a sex offender.

The Department is unable to project the number of offenders who may be subject to this new criminal penalty provision. The FY05 annual cost for an inmate in a DOC institution is approximately \$26,000 and \$2,000 for a community supervision placement.

Although a local impact will occur if an offender is sentenced to a jail term under the provisions of this bill, it is not possible to estimate how many offenders would receive this type of sentence.
