## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill changes the maximum penalty if the person has one or more prior convictions for first-degree sexual assault and is subsequently convicted of first-degree sexual assault. In that case, the court may impose a life sentence on the person without parole or extended supervision.

Felony proceedings generally require additional court appearances and more court hearings than misdemeanors. It is unlikely this bill's requirements will affect the number of these cases brought before the courts but may affect how the existing cases are handled. This bill may lead to increased numbers of court proceedings because the increased penalties may lead more persons to challenge the charges.

Additional court proceedings require additional judge, court reporter, court staff and juror time. These costs are borne by the state and the county.

An accurate estimate of the increased costs is impossible with existing data, although the number of persons who are charged for the second time with first-degree sexual assault is relatively small. Therefore, this bill is likely to have a minor impact on the overall workload of the courts.
