**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

If enacted, this bill would increase the fees for obtaining certified or uncertified copies of birth certificates. A portion of the increase would be forwarded to the department for disbursement to the Child Abuse and Neglect and Prevention Board.

The department is currently responsible for collecting and distributing these fees to the Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board. This bill requires no procedural changes to the disbursement process and consequently has no fiscal impact on the department.
