Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits retail or wholesale sellers that purchase petroleum-based fuel for resale from increasing their price of the fuel by more than the percent of increase in their acquisition, production, distribution or operating costs. Violation of this new provision may result in a term of imprisonment of up to 12.5 years (maximum of 7.5 years confinement and 5 years extended supervision).

The Department of Corrections is unable to project the number of offenders who may be subject to the criminal penalty provisions of this bill and is therefore unable to estimate the fiscal impact on state or local government. The FY05 annual cost for an inmate in a DOC institution is approximately \$26,000 and \$2,000 for a community supervision placement.

A local impact will occur if an offender is sentenced to a jail term under the provisions in this bill.
