Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law there are several prohibitions and penalties regarding the use and possession of certain controlled substances.

This bill increases the penalties for a person who possesses or attempts to possess the controlled substance ecstasy, commonly known as MDMA. Penalties under this bill would carry a term of imprisonment up to one-year in a county jail or a fine of not more than \$5,000 or both. However, if a person has been previously convicted of a controlled substance offence, that person could be found guilty of a Class I felony and may be fined up to \$10,000 or sentenced to a term of imprisonment of up to three and one-half years or both. If the sentence is for more than one year a term of extended supervision will follow confinement.

The Department of Corrections is unable to project the number of offenders who may be subject to the criminal penalty provisions of this bill and is therefore unable to estimate the fiscal impact on state or local government. The FY05 annual cost for an inmate in a DOC institution is approximately \$26,200 and \$2,030 for a community supervision placement.

A local impact will occur if an offender is sentenced to a longer jail term. The extent of this local fiscal impact is unknown.
