Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill could result in a significant increase in the number of homicide cases referred to district attorneys' offices depending on the extent to which reporting of cases of the death of fetuses in wombs and the state of health of the mother is carried out. To the extent that reports of fetal death and of possible drug use by the mother are sent to police authorities, there is the potential for a significant number of cases to be investigated and, potentially, prosecuted.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Unknown. The actual impact upon the workload of DA offices, were this bill to be enacted, should be closely monitored to determine if additional prosecutorial resources are needed.
