## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill reduces the potential for criminal conduct with regard to the controlled substance GBL and creates a new crime with regard to the substance BDO, which, in certain circumstances, would be made a controlled substance by this bill. There are no data by which to evaluate the net impact on the number of cases referred to the district attorneys' offices by law enforcement were this bill to be enacted.
