Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill changes mailing requirements for reorganizations that involve the detachment from one school district and the attachment to another school district of small territory (territory that constitutes less than seven percent of the equalized value of the former school district). Under current law, the School District Boundary Appeal Board (SDBAB) must send a certified copy of any reorganization resolution or order, by certified mail, to the clerk of each city, village, town, or county, any part of which is contained within an affected school district. Under the bill, a certified copy of any reorganization resolution or order would be sent, by certified mail, to the clerk of each city, village, or town in which any part of the territory is located, and to the clerk of each county in which any part of an affected school district is located. In summary, the bill removes the requirement that a certified copy be sent, by certified mail, to a city, village, or town that does not contain the territory. The bill does not change requirements for notification to county clerks.

State fiscal effect:

The department would realize some savings in mailing costs and staff time associated with preparing and sending certified mailings. Annually, these savings are estimated to be less than \$1,000, in addition to approximately 15 hours of support staff time.
