Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The department currently averages two complaints a year in which the complainant is billed for the cost of the investigation. If this bill becomes law and the "frivolous standard" is adopted it is estimated the department would probably only bill one complainant a year for the cost of an investigation. This would result in an estimated loss of \$250 revenue per year.

The department anticipates passage of this legislation probably will result in an additional 30 complaints filed with the department alleging violations of state prevailing wage laws. The department expects each complaint to consume 10 hours of investigator [Equal Rights Officer-Senior] time to investigate and resolve. The department believes it can absorb this workload.
