To the Honorable, the Legislature:

This report is transmitted as required by s. 20.002(11)(f), Wisconsin Statutes, (for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172(3), Wisconsin Statutes) and confirms that the Department of Administration has found it necessary to exercise the "temporary reallocation of balances" authority provided by this section in order to meet payment responsibilities and cover resulting negative cash balances during the month of July 2005.

On July 1, 2005, the General Fund cash balance closed at a negative \$262.7 million. The fund's negative cash balance continued intermittently through July 31, 2005, when the fund's cash balance closed at a negative \$417.1 million. The General Fund cash balance reached its intramonth low of a negative \$522.6 million on July 25, 2005. The negative balance was due to the difference in the timing of revenues and expenditures.

On July 6, 2005, the Medical Assistance Trust Fund cash balance closed at a negative \$5.1 million. The fund's negative cash balance continued through July 31, 2005, when the fund's cash balance closed at a negative \$2.6 million. The Medical Assistance Trust Fund cash balance closed at its intramonth low of a negative \$5.3 million on July 7, 2005. The negative balance was due to the difference in the timing of revenues and expenditures.

On July 27, 2005, the Wisconsin Health Education Loan Repayment Fund cash balance closed at its intramonth low of a negative \$3 thousand. This negative balance continued until July 28, 2005, when the fund's cash balance closed at a

positive \$22 thousand. The negative balance was due to the difference in the timing of revenues and expenditures.

The General Fund, the Medical Assistance Trust Fund, and the Wisconsin Health Education Loan Repayment Fund shortfalls were not in excess of the statutory interfund borrowing limitations and did not exceed the balances of the funds available for interfund borrowing.

The distribution of interest earnings to investment pool participants is based on the average daily balance in the pool

and each fund's share. Therefore, the monthly calculation by the State Controller's Office will automatically reflect the use of these temporary reallocations of balance authority, and as a result, the funds requiring the use of the authority will effectively bear the interest cost.
