2005 ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 45

December 13, 2005 - Introduced by COMMITTEE ON RULES.

1 **Relating to:** establishing special orders of business for Thursday, December 15,
2 2005.

3 *Resolved by the assembly, That:*

SECTION 1. Special order scheduled. The following proposals shall be special orders of business on Thursday, December 15, 2005, at the times shown:

- (1) At 11:01 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 15, relating to: ethanol requirements in automotive gasoline, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, granting rule-making authority, and providing a penalty.
- (2) At 11:02 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 21, relating to: computing expense deductions and amortization and depreciation on property used in farming for income and franchise tax purposes.
- (3) At 11:03 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 51, relating to: seizure by a court or law enforcement officer of a motor vehicle operator's license and reinstatement of an operating privilege.
- (4) At 11:04 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 187, relating to: information about real property purchased with stewardship money and public access to that property.
- (5) At 11:05 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 498, relating to: an income tax and franchise tax credit for property taxes paid on property owned by Goodwill Industries.

- (6) At 11:06 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 523, relating to: resident hunting and fishing approvals for members of the armed forces.
- (7) At 11:07 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 574, relating to: the prohibition of certain billing practices for consumer goods or services, lawn care service contracts, and providing penalties.
- (8) At 11:08 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 586, relating to: hunting and firearm possession by persons who are under 16 years of age.
- (9) At 11:09 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 594, relating to: repossession of goods in consumer credit transactions and certain consumer leases.
- (10) At 11:10 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 614, relating to: the settlement of personal property taxes on improvements to leased land.

- (14) At 11:14 a.m., 2005 Assembly Bill 850, relating to: the regulation of certain wharves, piers, boat shelters, boat hoists, and boat lifts.
- (15) At 11:15 a.m., 2005 Senate Bill 206, relating to: transportation for pupils participating in the open enrollment program.
- (16) At 11:16 a.m., 2005 Senate Bill 426, relating to: various changes in the unemployment insurance law, authorized positions for the department of justice, making appropriations, and providing penalties.
