Dear Secretary Nelson:

The Assembly State Affairs Committee adopted the following motion with respect to Clearinghouse Rule 05-033:

MOVED, that the Assembly Committee on State Affairs, pursuant to s. 227.19 (4) (b) 2., Stats., requests the Department of Health and Family Services to consider modifying Clearinghouse Rule 05-033, relating to dental services under the medical assistance program, to delete the provisions of the rule relating to certification of dental hygienists for purposes of medical assistance reimbursement. These provisions are contained in ss. HFS 105.01 (5) (a) 1., HFS 105.01 (5m), HFS 105.06 (2), HFS 107.07 (1m), and HFS 107.07 (4m).

If the Department of Health and Family Services does not agree to this request to consider modifications to the rule, in a letter addressed to the Chairperson of the Assembly Committee on State Affairs and received by the Chairperson no later than 4:30 p.m. on April 19, 2006, then the Assembly Committee on State Affairs objects to ss. HFS 105.01 (5) (a) 1., HFS 105.01 (5m), HFS 105.06 (2), HFS 107.07 (1m), and HFS 107.07 (4m), pursuant to s. 227.19 (4) (b) 5. and (d), Stats., on the grounds that these portions of the proposed rule are arbitrary and capricious, and impose an undue hardship.

The motion was adopted on a vote of Ayes, 6; Noes, 3.

At the public hearing of the Assembly State Affairs Committee, various dentists raised concerns about directly reimbursing dental hygienists for dental care without a requirement that such care be under the direction of a dentist who has also examined the patient.
