Dear Senator Kanavas:

Thank you for your letter of December 19, 2006, in which you ask about the status of our audit of the Medicaid Dental HMO Program.

You are correct that we had initially planned a release of this report in late 2005. We have delayed its release.

The delay in the release of this report is in part the result of competing priorities as we completed work on a number of major program evaluation reports in 2006. Those reports included Milwaukee County Child Welfare, Fish and Wildlife Funding, State Economic Development Programs, Personnel Policies and Practices in the University of Wisconsin System, Employment of Felons in both the University of Wisconsin System and the Wisconsin Technical College System, and an evaluation of Chronic Wasting Disease management.

However, we have worked in recent months to gather more current information from the Department of Health and Family Services about the level of Medicaid dental services provided statewide. This information includes data on the level of services provided in the counties served by HMOs, as well as those counties whose citizens receive services under the fee-for-service program. We have also very recently obtained information from the Department concerning changes in its contractual relationship with the HMOs. This new information will be included in the audit, which we now anticipate releasing in early 2007.

I regret this unfortunate delay occurred, but I will contact you as the report release date is finalized. Please contact me if I can be of further assistance at this time.
