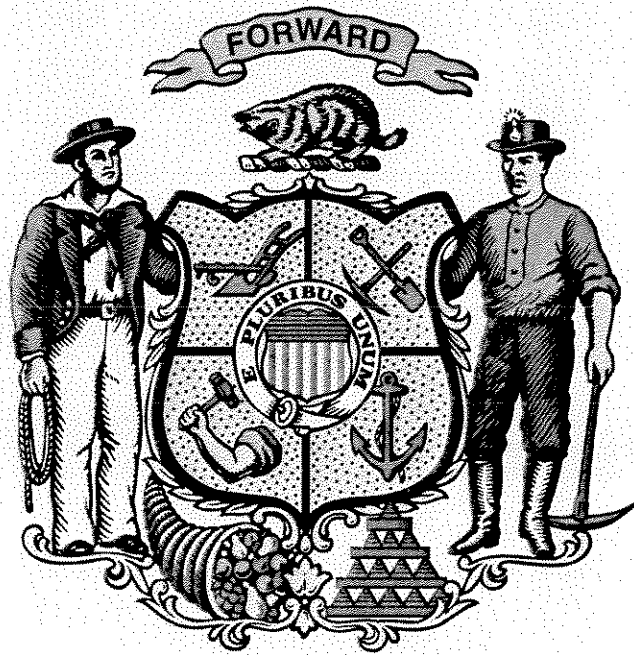

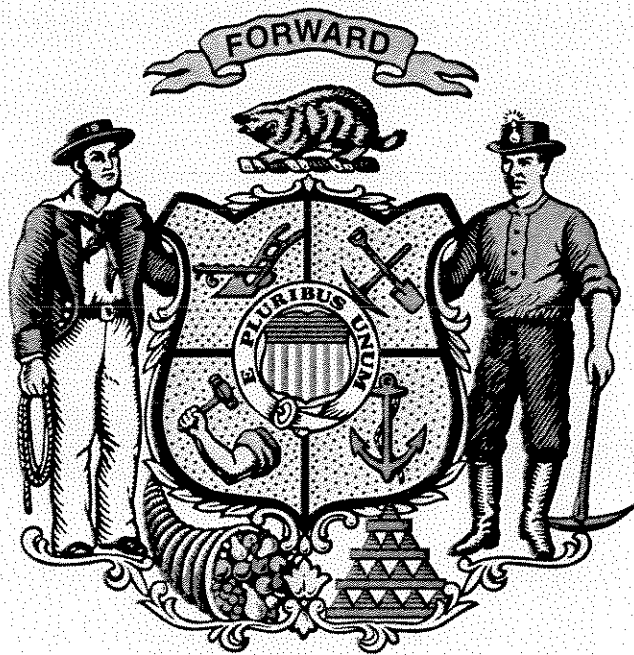

Dear Rpbbe,

You were nominated by Midwest Environmental Advocates and Trout Unlimited to serve on the Livestock Facility Siting Review Board (Board). I have selected you as the member of the Board representing environmental interests, subject to confirmation by the Senate. You will join six other members, three of which must represent towns, counties, and livestock farming interests. Your term for this seat expires May 1, 2009.

The livestock facility siting law created the Board as a new option to appeal local decisions to approve or deny a proposed livestock facility or expansion. The Board will hear appeals from "aggrieved parties", including the livestock facility operator and any persons who live within 2 miles of the proposed facility. I believe the Board is key to successfully implementing the livestock facility siting program and reducing local siting conflicts.

The schedule of the Board will depend entirely on the number of appeals. I anticipate the Board will meet more frequently during the first year--possibly six to eight times -- and then less frequently over time. The Board will have two to three organizational meetings prior to hearing any appeals.

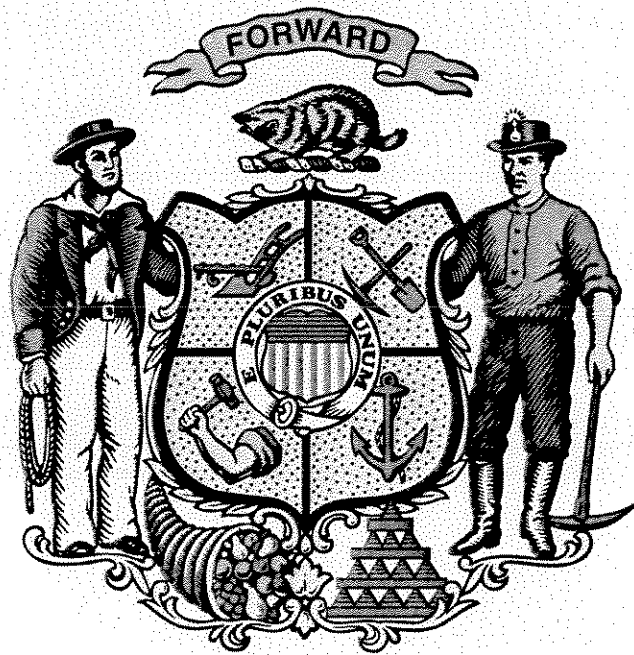



Mr. Selk will be available to the Senate for hearings and my staff will assist in any way they can.

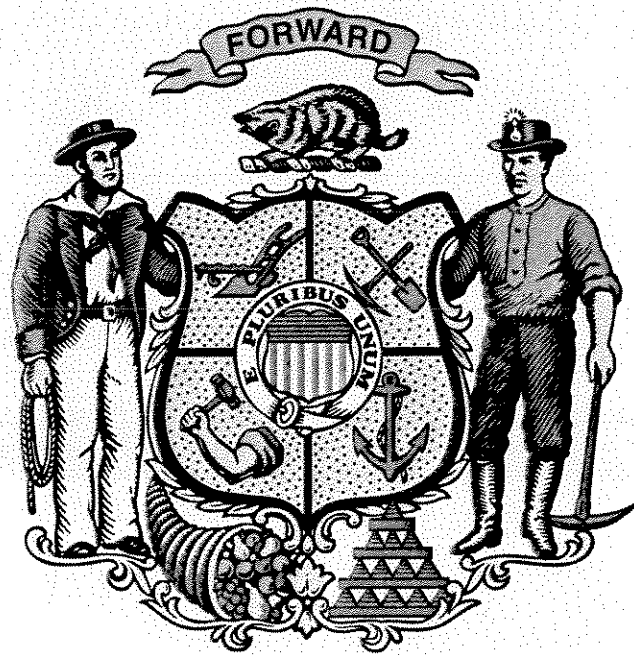

Dr. Jerome Gaska, Columbus, WI

Dr. Gaska works exclusively with dairy farms; his largest client milks 1,800 cows. He has worked with expanding farms and has the respect of his clients and the veterinary community. Dr. Gaska has been in practice since 1989 when he graduated from the University of Wisconsin School of Veterinary Medicine and has been a solo practitioner since 1993. Currently Dr. Gaska is a member of the WVMA's Public Health and Food Safety Committee.
