

Testimony of Steve Olson
Alderman, City of Franklin

Honorable Senator Zien, Representative Suder, committee members, I thank you for your service to your constituents and the State of Wisconsin.

Protection of our people is a primary responsibility for all elected officials. Two of the measures before you today provide a tangible result in this effort.

AB975/SB537 is effective in sharing the burden of transitioning sexually violent persons between communities and I urge your support of this bill. This bill appropriately prevents the concentration of sexually violent persons and effectively "spreads the pain" and potential adverse economic and social impacts of transitioning these predators. Essentially, it as well prevents transporting one community's problems to another by State fiat.

In testimony before this Senate committee almost to the day two years ago on AB-861 I made the statement that still holds true today. "We'll take care of our own, don't give us everyone else's (sexually violent persons)." This bill assures that each community will need to take responsibility for their own sexually violent persons.

In addition, we have seen a great deal of public outcry over the concept of housing up to 12, and some reports say many more, sexually violent persons in one facility. I personally believe that this outcry is justified. The economic impact of such a facility will be severe. The social impact of such a concentration will be even worse.

Passage of AB974/SB536 is important to protect our communities from a devastating social and economic blow with construction of a transitional facility for at least a dozen of the worst sex offenders. You, our elected leaders will be considering several bills this session that will correct several unforeseen issues with section 980 of our State Statutes. Until you have thoughtfully considered these corrections and acted on them, the specter of construction of such a facility looms large over Milwaukee County.

The legislative record for this facility indicates that somehow the convenience of the Department of Health and Family Services trumps the safety and peace of mind of our constituents. That reason alone was the justification for construction of such a dangerous facility. (Legislative Reference Bureau Paper 502, 5/21/01)

The most appropriate action that can be taken to protect our communities and our children is to remove bonding authority for a Transitional Facility for Sexually Violent Persons from the budget.

I urge you to protect our communities and children with the passage of these four bills.

I again thank you for your consideration and service to the people of the State of Wisconsin.
