

Re: Transporting uncased, unloaded fire arms on Shooting Ranges with non-highway use vehicles.

Problem: Shooting enthusiasts are under the threat of being fined, and have been warned for having their firearm not properly cased on their carts, or for even leaning on the carts with an uncased firearm based on st. 167.31 (2)(b). Many ranges allow shooters to use a cart to get around the course.

Reasons why shooting ranges should be exempt:

- range rules standards already exist for safety (liability ins. requires them posted)
- illegal shooting of game animals does not occur on a range and is not an issue
- states around us do not require cased guns on carts on ranges
- length of courses are getting longer with the growth of the sport and our shooter are getting older and need the carts to get them around the events
- it would clear up the confusion of our out of state shooters coming to our ranges in Wis.
- would benefit another aspect of our tourism in the state by making it more user friendly (e.g. last years state shoot had over two thousand entries over the five days of shooting opportunities.)



Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. my name is Steve Williams. I am proud to tell you that I am the President of the Wisconsin Game Preserve Association (WGPA). I am also the owner of Wern Valley, which is located in western Waukesha County. I am attaching to this testimony an informational brochure about the WGPA . This will give you some idea of the programs and services we offer the general public and our members.

My mission here today is to say thank you for the way this particular proposal, Senate Bill 464 and its companion bill, Assembly Bill 864, was brought to the attention of this Committee. I am also here to lend my organization's strong support for this simple and important piece of Legislation.

In February of 2005, a group of sporting clays operators went to the chief law enforcement personnel at the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. We talked specifically about our concerns with enforcement of the current state statutes. We asked for input from the DNR and what they thought about any change in law. We knew this would be a very difficult topic for them to deal with. We appreciated their honest answers.

Some time later we received word that these changes as proposed in SB 464 would be very difficult for them to support. As time went on, other Legislative contacts were made at public and private meetings about the need to change the law, or at least to have a good public discussion of current practices and enforcement difficulties. We believe the DNR needs to be involved in consulting and advising the shooting preserves and sporting clay operators and the Wisconsin Legislature.

We are strongly committed to public safety for our members and the general public. The limited scope and nature of this bill will ensure that the top public policy priority of safety continue. When this legislation is adopted, we will work cooperatively with all enforcement personnel.



**Testimony Supporting SB 464: Gun Casing Exception for Shooting Ranges
Assembly Committee on Natural Resources
January 5, 2006**

Thank you for hearing testimony today on SB 464, legislation creating an exception to current law prohibiting the transport of firearms, under very specific circumstances. Senate Bill 464 would allow sportsmen at shooting ranges who use golf carts to travel from station to station, to transport their *unloaded* firearm in the cart without casing it.

Passing SB 464 will help shooting ranges across Wisconsin meet their customer's needs. Ranges in Wisconsin are getting larger, and sometimes customers need transportation so that they can travel the course in a timely manner. And, when Wisconsin sport shooting ranges host large events with hundreds of participants, it's more efficient for them to move people around the course with golf carts.

Wisconsin is one of just a few states that does not already allow vehicular transport of unloaded, uncased guns on shooting ranges. Many people attending larger shooting events here are from states that allow uncased transport, as long as the gun is unloaded. When visitors from out-of-state attend events in Wisconsin they may be confused about their ability to legally transport their firearms, and run the risk of being fined.


SB 464 is very narrowly drafted so that it only applies to off-road vehicles with four rubber-tired wheels that are transporting individuals engaging in sport shooting, and are operated entirely on private property. This does not apply for anyone who is hunting or driving on a public highway or right of way, and the provisions of the bill do not apply to ATVs.

Passage of this bill should not raise any safety issues, because shooting ranges already have strict safety rules for all customers, which is typically required in order to retain their liability insurance purposes. Further, firearms transported in this manner cannot be loaded.

Current law subjects enthusiasts who are lawfully engaging in their sport to the threat of fines for actions that common sense indicates they can do safely and responsibly. It's time to change the law to recognize how most sport shooting ranges function today.

(8) Any violation of this section coming to the attention of the department of commerce or municipal authorities shall be reported to the attorney general or district attorney for prosecution.

167.30 Use of firearms, etc., near park, etc. Any person who shall discharge or cause the discharge of any missile from any firearm, slung shot, bow and arrow or other weapon, within 40 rods of any public park, square or enclosure owned or controlled by any municipality within this state and resorted to for recreation or pleasure, when such park, square or enclosure is wholly situated without the limits of such municipality, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding 60 days or by fine of not more than \$25 nor less than one dollar.

167.31 Safe use and transportation of firearms and bows. (1) DEFINITIONS. In this section:

- (a) "Aircraft" has the meaning given under s. 114.002 (3).
- (b) "Encased" means enclosed in a case that is expressly made for the purpose of containing a firearm and that is completely zipped, snapped, buckled, tied or otherwise fastened with no part of the firearm exposed.
- (bg) "Family member of the landowner" means a person who is related to the landowner as a parent, child, spouse, or sibling.
- (bn) "Farm tractor" has the meaning given in s. 340.01 (16).
- (c) "Firearm" means a weapon that acts by force of gunpowder.
- (d) "Highway" has the meaning given under s. 340.01 (22).
- (dm) "Implement of husbandry" has the meaning given in s. 340.01 (24).
- (e) "Motorboat" has the meaning given under s. 30.50 (6).
- (em) "Peace officer" has the meaning given in s. 939.22 (22).
- (f) "Roadway" has the meaning given under s. 340.01 (54).
- (fm) "Street" means a highway that is within the corporate limits of a city or village.
- (g) "Unloaded" means any of the following:
 1. Having no shell or cartridge in the chamber of a firearm or in the magazine attached to a firearm.
 2. In the case of a cap lock muzzle-loading firearm, having the cap removed.
 3. In the case of a flint lock muzzle-loading firearm, having the flashpan cleaned of powder.
- (h) "Vehicle" has the meaning given in s. 340.01 (74), and includes a snowmobile, as defined in s. 340.01 (58a), and an electric personal assistive mobility device, as defined in s. 340.01 (15pm), except that for purposes of subs. (4) (c) and (cg) and (4m) "vehicle" has the meaning given for "motor vehicle" in s. 29.001 (57).

(2) PROHIBITIONS: MOTORBOATS AND VEHICLES: HIGHWAYS AND ROADWAYS. (a) Except as provided in sub. (4), no person may place, possess or transport a firearm, bow or crossbow in or on a motorboat with the motor running, unless the firearm is unloaded or unless the bow or crossbow is unstrung or is enclosed in a carrying case.

(b) Except as provided in sub. (4), no person may place, possess or transport a firearm, bow or crossbow in or on a vehicle, unless the firearm is unloaded and encased or unless the bow or crossbow is unstrung or is enclosed in a carrying case.

(c) Except as provided in sub. (4), no person may load or discharge a firearm or shoot a bolt or an arrow from a bow or crossbow in or from a vehicle.

(d) Except as provided in sub. (4) (a), (bg), (cg), (e), and (g), no person may discharge a firearm or shoot a bolt or an arrow from a bow or crossbow from or across a highway or within 50 feet of the center of a roadway.

(e) A person who violates pars. (a) to (d) is subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$100.

(3) PROHIBITIONS: AIRCRAFT. (a) Except as provided in sub. (4), no person may place, possess or transport a firearm, bow or crossbow in or on an aircraft, unless the firearm is unloaded and

encased or unless the bow or crossbow is unstrung or is enclosed in a carrying case.

(b) Except as provided in sub. (4), no person may load or discharge a firearm or shoot a bolt or an arrow from a bow or crossbow in or from an aircraft.

(c) A person who violates par. (a) or (b) shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than 90 days or both.

(4) EXCEPTIONS. (a) Subsections (2) and (3) do not apply to any of the following who, in the line of duty, place, possess, transport, load or discharge a firearm in, on or from a vehicle, motorboat or aircraft or discharge a firearm from or across a highway or within 50 feet of the center of a roadway:

2. A member of the U.S. armed forces.

3. A member of the national guard.

4. A private security person, as defined in s. 440.26 (1m), who meets all of the following requirements:

a. He or she holds either a private detective license issued under s. 440.26 (2) (a) 2. or a private security permit issued under s. 440.26 (5).

b. He or she holds a certificate of proficiency to carry a firearm issued by the department of regulation and licensing.

c. He or she is performing his or her assigned duties or responsibilities.

d. He or she is wearing a uniform that clearly identifies him or her as a private security person.

e. His or her firearm is in plain view, as defined by rule by the department of regulation and licensing.

(am) 1. Subsections (2) (a), (c) and (d) and (3) (a) and (b) do not apply to a peace officer who, in the line of duty, loads or discharges a firearm in, on or from a vehicle, motorboat or aircraft or discharges a firearm from or across a highway or within 50 feet of the center of a roadway.

2. Subsection (2) (b) does not apply to a peace officer who places, possesses or transports a firearm in or on a vehicle, motorboat or aircraft while in the line of duty.

3. Subsection (2) (b) does not apply to a person employed as a peace officer who places, possesses or transports a firearm in or on a vehicle while traveling in the vehicle from his or her residence to his or her place of employment as a peace officer.

(b) Subsections (2) (a), (b) and (c) and (3) (a) and (b) do not apply to the holder of a scientific research license under s. 169.25 or a scientific collector permit under s. 29.614 who is using a net gun or tranquilizer gun in an activity related to the purpose for which the license or permit was issued.


(bg) 1. Subsection (2) (a), (b), (c), and (d) does not apply to a state employee or agent, or to a federal employee or agent, who is acting within the scope of his or her employment or agency, who is authorized by the department of natural resources to take animals in the wild for the purpose of controlling the spread of disease in animals and who is hunting in an area designated by the department of natural resources as a chronic wasting disease eradication zone, except that this subdivision does not authorize the discharge of a firearm or the shooting of a bolt or arrow from a bow or crossbow across a state trunk highway, county trunk highway, or paved town highway.

1g. Subsection (2) (b) and (c) does not apply to a landowner, a family member of the landowner, or an employee of the landowner who is using a firearm, bow, or crossbow to shoot wild animals from a farm tractor or an implement of husbandry on the landowner's land that is located in an area designated by the department of natural resources as a chronic wasting disease eradication zone.

1m. Subsection (3) (a) and (b) does not apply to a state employee or agent or a federal employee or agent hunting an animal in the wild as authorized under s. 29.307 (2).

2. This paragraph does not apply after June 30, 2004.

(bn) Subsection (2) (a) does not apply to a person using a bow or a crossbow for fishing from a motorboat.





Scott, here is the information you requested from Natural Resources Code. The source is a program referred to as "WisLaw" that all DNR legal staff should have and is updated quarterly.

NR10.09(2) SPECIAL ONE-DAY RESTRICTION. During the 24-hour period prior to the opening date for the regular gun deer season established in s. NR 10.01 (3) (e), no person may possess a gun wherein there is an open season for deer with guns specified in s. NR 10.01 (3) (e), unless the gun is unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case. Exceptions:

NR 10.09(2)(a)

(a) Target shooting at established ranges.

NR 10.09(2)(b)

(b) Hunting on licensed game farms and shooting preserves.

NR 10.09(2)(c)

(c) Hunting waterfowl during the open season.

"Established ranges" are defined in NR Code 10.001(9e):

NR 10.001(9e) "Established range" means an existing facility that has target shooting with firearms as its major purpose.

Maybe you were around during the "good old days" of Wisconsin bird hunting. Or maybe you only heard the old-timers telling you about it. Well, the good old days aren't gone. On a Wisconsin hunting preserve you can find yesterday's hunting today.

WHAT ARE HUNTING PRESERVES?

They are licensed hunting areas that offer hunting from September 1 to April 15 or year-round hunting for ring-necked pheasants, bobwhite quail and chukar and Hungarian partridge. Some hunting preserves feature all of these game birds; some may specialize in only one or two kinds.

Hunting preserves are open to the public on a daily fee and/or annual membership basis. There's something for everyone - and as much hunting as you want.

WHAT TO EXPECT ON A HUNTING PRESERVE

For starters, a warm welcome. You are a valued customer, and your host will do everything he can to provide a safe, enjoyable hunt.

You can expect the area to look like good hunting country with a rich blend of natural and planted cover. The game birds will be mature, full-plumaged, strong flyers and of the same color and conformation as their wild counterparts.

There will be experienced guides and well trained hunting dogs available, or on many preserves you can use your own dog if you wish.

Like shopping for a new suit, you may have to shop around for the preserve that fits your tastes and desires.

Whether you're a youngster dreaming of your first real bird hunt with that new shotgun or a seasoned hunter longing for a red-letter day of good dog-work and flighty birds, you will find it on a Wisconsin hunting preserve.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

That depends on how much hunting you want. Some hunting preserves charge a set fee for game birds released; others charge for half-day or full-day hunts. In either case, fees will vary somewhat from preserve to preserve. Most preserves charge a minimum fee per hunter or hunting party. Extra services, such as clay target shooting and/or dressing game birds, will add to the charges.

But one thing is for sure: a day on a hunting preserve is likely to cost no more money than a so-called "free hunt" and will certainly cost much less time. Today, most sportsmen spend a great deal of time, money and effort just hunting for hunting - and what they find is often disappointing.

Wherever you live in Wisconsin, there is a good hunting preserve within easy driving distance. If you are a typical hunter without landowner contracts, that preserve may be the most practical (and in the long run, the cheapest) way to spend a day afield with a dog, gun and game birds.

Try a hunting preserve. Your search for good hunting will be over.


