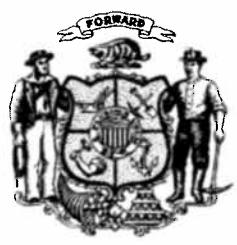

**PUBLIC HEARING DEMONSTRATES CRITICAL NEED
FOR BETTER STUDENT FIRE PROTECTION**

Madison, WI – A hearing will be held today at 10:00 AM in Room 225 Northwest in the State Capitol regarding AB 544, the College Dorm Legislation. The bill requires fire sprinklers in all private college residential facilities and privately owned dorms that are 60 feet or greater, all sororities and fraternities, as well as all newly constructed student residential facilities.

Dana Christmas will share her experience about surviving an early morning dorm fire when she was a freshman at Seton Hall University on January 19, 2000. The fire killed three students and injured 58. Christmas experienced severe burns.

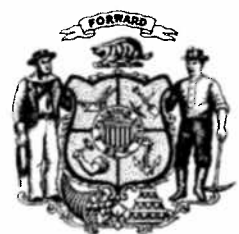
Madison Fire Chief Amesqua's testimony includes information about the history of fires with and without fire sprinklers in University of Wisconsin schools and private colleges. Ed Comeau, Director, Center for Campus Fire Safety, will provide testimony from a campus perspective along with Buddy Dewar, Director of Regional Operations for the National Fire Sprinkler Association.

Following the public hearing, a live burn demonstration is scheduled at the top of State Street and the Capitol Square. Two 8 x 8 rooms will be set up complete with furniture. One room will be protected with a fire sprinkler system, the other will not. In both rooms, a trash can fire will be lit. The fire will be spread up the curtain. In the sprinklered room, viewers will see the sprinkler activate and quickly control the fire. The demonstration will provide a close up view of the life-saving effectiveness of a fire sprinkler system compared to a fire that will quickly spread. The demonstration is scheduled for 1:00 pm.
