Moved by Senator Harsdorf, seconded by Senator Kanavas that **Assembly Bill 100** be recommended for because the provisions of the bill relating to tax exemptions have been substantially altered by action of the Joint Committee on Finance, the Joint Survey Committee on Tax Exemptions takes no position with respect to the bill's tax exemption provisions as a matter of public policy.

BECAUSE THE PROVISIONS OF THE BILL RELATING TO TAX EXEMPTIONS HAVE BEEN SUBSTANTIALLY ALTERED BY ACTION OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FINANCE, THE JOINT SURVEY COMMITTEE ON TAX EXEMPTIONS TAKES NO POSITION WITH RESPECT TO THE BILL'S TAX EXEMPTION PROVISIONS AS A MATTER OF PUBLIC POLICY. OF RECOMMENDATION NOT RECOMMENDED, Ayes 4, Noes 4

Moved by Senator Jauch, seconded by Senator Kanavas that **Assembly Bill 100** be recommended for The Joint Survey Committee on Tax Exemptions finds that there is questionable

public policy concerning tax exemptions in both Assembly Bill 100 and in the version of the bill recommended by the Joint Committee on Finance.
