Report approved by the Governor with partial veto on 5-16-2008. 2007 Wisconsin Act 226.

Relating to: disclosure of juvenile court records to other courts, law enforcement agencies, district attorneys and other prosecutors, and agencies providing services to a juvenile court and providing a penalty.

By Representatives Jeskewitz, Kestell, Ziegelbauer, Grigsby, Ballweg, Vos, Albers, Hahn and Sinicki; cosponsored by Senators Sullivan, Darling and Roessler.

Report vetoed by the Governor on 4-17-2008.
