Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, municipalities are authorized to issue temporary "Class B" licenses to certain clubs, fair associations, agricultural societies, churches, veterans organizations, lodges, and societies. These temporary licenses authorize the retail sale of wine at fairs, meetings, picnics, and similar gatherings hosted by these organizations. A municipality may not issue to one of these organizations more than two temporary "Class B" licenses in any twelve month period.

Under the bill, the number of temporary "Class B" licenses that a municipality may issue to one of these organizations is increased from two to ten in any twelve month period. As under current law, the amount of the fee for a license shall be \$10, except that no fee may be charged to a person who at the same time applies for a temporary Class "B" license for the same event.

Given the \$10 fee, the bill has no significant impact on local revenues. Local costs to issue licenses may increase, but this impact is also expected to be insignificant.

The department does not expect and additional expenses.
