Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill establishes a statutory definition for "invasive fish species" and prohibits an individual from possessing, releasing, controlling, storing, selling, or transporting them. The prohibition does not apply to individuals that:

- 1) hold a scientific collector permit;
- 2) hold a permit to import fish;
- 3) hold a permit to introduce, plant, or stock fish;
- 4) operate a fish farm;
- 5) operate a state or municipal fish hatchery; or
- 6) are authorized by the Department to possess, release, control, sell, or transport fish or fish eggs for scientific or educational purposes or for the purpose of controlling the population of fish that are invasive fish species.

In addition, the bill requires the Department to promulgate rules that identify which fish species are considered to be invasive.

The Department assumes that an individual would need to obtain Department approval to possess, release, control, store, sell or transport invasive fish species or eggs. Given that the bill exempts persons in categories 1 through 5 above, the Department assumes that persons in category 6 would primarily include those employed in the aquarium trade industry at either the wholesale or retail level and their customers. According to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2002 Economic Census, there are 143 pet and pet supply stores in Wisconsin. The Department assumes that this is indicative of the number of establishments/individuals that would need to obtain Department approval under this bill.

The Department estimates that staff time would be needed to establish a permit program, track the permits via a database management system, enforce the permit regulations, and promulgate rules.

The Department assumes that one FTE at the senior level water resources management specialist classification would be needed annually to oversee the approval process. Position costs for a water resources management specialist are estimated to be \$61,600 (\$20.498/hr @ 2080 hrs. = \$42,600 salary + \$19,000 fringe).

The Department also assumes that it would incur one-time costs associated with developing a database system for tracking approvals (\$80/hr x 200 hours = \$16,000), and ongoing costs related to maintaining the system (\$6,000 annually). The Department further assumes that it would incur approximately \$15,000 in salary-related and supply expenditures related to drafting the administrative rules referenced in the bill.

Additional enforcement workload may be incurred to enforce the prohibitions in the bill. However, the degree to which this would prompt the need for additional staff in the Bureau of Law Enforcement is only speculative at this time.
