A person or entity that uses a radio frequency identification (RFID) system that can be used to gather information about an individual shall obtain written consent from an individual before any personally identifiable information of the individual, including name, address, telephone number, or creditcard number, is attached to or stored with data collected via the RFID system.
- 22651. A person or entity shall obtain separate written consent from an individual before any personally identifiable information about the individual collected by anRFID system is shared with a third party.
- 22652. An individual shall have the right to access his or her personally identifiable information collected through an RFID system and the opportunity to make corrections to that information.
- 22653.A person or entity shall take reasonable measures to ensure that any individual data collected via an RFID system is transmitted and stored in a secure manner, and that access to the datais limited to those individuals needed to operate and maintainthe RFID system.
- 22654. If a retail store uses an RFID system on a consumer product, the RFID tag shall be detached ordestroyed before a consumer leaves the store.
- 22655. Collecting information through an RFID system that is aggregate innature and that does not personally identify an individual is not a violation of this chapter.
  - 22656. A violation of this chapter is an act of unfair competition under Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 17200) of

Division 7 and subject to the enforcement provisions of that chapter.


