Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law requires a municipality, including a county, city, village, town, or school district, to publish a legal notice in a newspaper with paid circulation that is likely to give notice in the area or to the person affected. Generally, this means a newspaper that has at least two years of publication experience in the municipality and a paid circulation of at least 50 percent of its total circulation.

The bill allows a municipality the additional option of posting the notice on the Internet site of the municipality.
