## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The proposed legislation would provide status as state agents of the Department of Health and Family Services to volunteer health care providers who provide services under the Volunteer Health Care Provider Program. These volunteers would not be required to have medical malpractice insurance coverage that would extend to the provision of these services.

If enacted, the state would be required to cover the liability for these health care providers when they are providing services under the volunteer program. The current provisions of the state statutes limiting the state payment of damage would not apply.

It is not possible to estimate the potential cost of this proposed legislation. It is unknown what, if any, costs have been covered by the provider's medical malpractice insurance. It is also unknown how many additional lawsuits would be filed as long as the state is providing the primary coverage and the limits on the payment of damage would be removed.
