

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Regulation by Department of Commerce

Under current law, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) promulgates rules for the electric construction in public buildings and places of employment and for the inspection of such construction. Commerce also promulgates rules for the inspection of electrical work, but not its construction, in places where farming is conducted. This bill expands Commerce's duty in this regard to promulgate a state wiring code that establishes standards for installing, repairing, and maintaining electrical wiring, regardless of what type of building is involved. It also requires Commerce to promulgate rules for the inspection of all electrical wiring. The bill defines "electrical wiring" to be equipment and wiring for the production and control of electrical energy, except for the equipment and wiring used by public utilities and electric cooperatives for the generation and transmission of electricity to their customers.

Under current law, every contractor, designer, and owner must use materials, methods, and equipment that conform with the rules described above. This bill expands this requirement so that all persons must use materials, methods, and equipment that conform with the state electrical wiring code.

### Electrical contractors and electricians

Under current law, Commerce must administer a program for certifying electrical contractors. Current law authorizes a city, village, town, or county (municipality) to license contractors if the electrical contractor has as an employee and at least one master electrician. Current law requires that a master electrician pass an examination administered by Commerce. However, current law does not specifically require that a person who works as an electrician be licensed or certified by Commerce. Under this bill, a municipality may no longer license a contractor, resulting in the elimination of any requirement that electrical contractors be licensed or certified either by a municipality or the state. Also, the bill specifically prohibits municipalities from registering or licensing electricians. Instead, under the bill, Commerce is required to promulgate rules for the licensing and examination of all types of electricians, including journeyman and master electricians, but excluding beginning electricians. Under the bill, beginning electricians are required to be registered but do not need to pass an examination. The bill requires that any person working as an electrician must be registered or licensed by Commerce, with certain exemptions. The bill also requires that no person may do electrical work unless a master electrician is at all times responsible for the work.

The bill specifies several persons who are exempt from licensing or registration, including individuals who perform certain types of electrical work on their own residences or in their own facilities, persons who perform electrical work on elevators

In addition to the rules required to be promulgated by Commerce for all electricians, the bill imposes specific requirements as to the amount of experience necessary to be licensed as a residential or nonresidential journeyman electrician.

Electrical inspections

Under current law, a municipality may enact an ordinance regulating electrical construction and the inspection of electrical instruction if the ordinance meets the minimum state requirements. Under current law, Commerce is required to contract with a municipality for inspections of electrical wiring for compliance with state law if the municipality has enacted such an ordinance and if Commerce is requested to do so by the municipality. Commerce is also required to provide such inspection in a municipality that has not enacted such an ordinance. Also, Commerce may, at the request of the owner or tenant, inspect the exterior and interior wiring of a public building or place of employment to determine compliance with state law. Current law also requires the company furnishing electric current to obtain proof of compliance with state law before furnishing the current.

This bill chainates all of these provisions Instead, the bill requires Commerce to promulgate rules establishing standards and a process for the inspection of electrical wiring, including the inspection of electrical wiring for which a municipality does not provide inspection. The bill specifically prohibits municipalities from certifying electrical inspectors.

- (1) ELECTRICIANS COUNCIL. Notwithstanding the length of terms specified for the members of the electricians council under section 15.157 (14) of the statutes, as created by this act, the initial members who are electricians shall be appointed for the following terms:
- (a) One member who is a master electrician and one member who is a journeyman electrician for terms expiring on July 1, 2008
- (b) One member who is a master electrician, one member who is a journeyman electrician, and the member who is an electrical inspector for terms expiring on July 1,2009.
- **Section 41. Effective dates.** This act takes effect on the day after publication, except as follows:

#### **Insert 2B**

Under current law, Commerce administers a program for certifying electrical contractors. Under current law, a city, village, town, or county (municipality) may license an electrical contractor if the contractor has at least one master electrician as an employee. Current law requires the Commerce promulgate rules establishing a uniform examination for the statewide certification of master electricians. To be certified as a master electrician by Commerce, current law requires that the electrician pass a uniform examination established by Commerce by rule.

LRB 3429/2 - Electrician Licensing

Mary,

Work continues on reaching a consensus on the electrician licensing bill you've drafted for our office.

Based on our last stakeholder meeting, we need to have the following changes made to the draft.

- Under current law, electrical contractors can voluntarily be licensed by the state. Some municipalities require
  electrical contractors to be licensed. Please change the draft to make the state's voluntary licensing program
  mandatory. Specify that the license shall be renewed on a fixed 3-year cycle. Similar to the mandatory electrician
  license created in the bill, prohibit municipalities from licensing an electrical contractor.
- Page 11, line 12: Change 48 to 60.
- Remove the "Electricians Council" created in Section 1.
- Adjust the effective date section per our previous discussions.

(The statewide application of section 101.862 (1), (2), and (3) which addresses licensing requirements, that no person may wire without license and the exemptions from licensing would be effective 25 months after publication - giving Commerce time to work out the administrative rules. However, Section 101.862 (4) which states that a municipality may not impose any registration, licensing, or certification requirements on electricians or inspectors, appears to be effective immediately with the rest of the bill. The concern is that if municipalities have to end their licensing as soon as the bill is enacted, but the statewide standards are not implemented until 2 years later, the regulations would be left in limbo for that time. It would make sense to allow current processes to continue even though they are not statewide until the state is ready to take over and thus include section 101.862 (4) in the effective date 25 months after publication rather than immediately.)

Considering the request to have contractor licensing changed from a voluntary to mandatory, I'm wondering if you think that the language of 2005 Act 200 (which was SB 512) already covers the issue of mandatory licensing for electrical contractors? If it does, I'm not certain that we need to specify contractor licensing in this bill.

I understand it's the very end of the session. It is our goal to have all the kinks worked out of this draft so we're ready to hit the ground running right away next session with a clean bill.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Regulation by Department of Commerce

Under current law, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) promulgates rules for electric construction in public buildings and places of employment and in places where farming is conducted. This bill expands Commerce's duty in this regard with to promulgate a state wiring code that establishes standards for installing, a popul repairing, and maintaining electrical wiring, regardless of what type of building is involved. It also requires Commerce to promulgate rules for the inspection of all of electrical wiring. The bill defines "electrical wiring" to be equipment and wiring for the production and control of electrical energy; "electrical wiring" does not include the equipment and wiring used by public utilities, electric cooperatives, or operators or Move of wholesale merchant plants, for the generation, transmission, and distribution of electricity to their customers or members. (A "wholesale merchant plant" is a plant that is generally not owned by a public utility and that provides service to wholesale customers. Dand o ther

 ${\it Electrical f} contractors~and~electricians$ 

Under current law, Commerce administers a program for certifying electrical contractors. Under current law, a city, village, town, or county (municipality) may license an electrical contractor if the contractor has at least one master electrician as an employee. Current law requires Commerce to promulgate rules establishing a uniform examination for the statewide certification of master electricians. To be certified as a master electrician by Commerce, current law requires that the electrician pass the uniform examination. However, current law does not specifically require that a person who works as an electrician be licensed or certified by Commerce. Under this bill, a municipality may no longer license a contractor, resulting in the elimination of any requirement that electrical contractors be licensed or certified either by a municipality or the state. Also, the bill specifically prohibits municipalities from registering or licensing electricians. Instead, under the bill, Commerce is required to promulgate rules for the licensing and examination of all types of electricians, including journeyman and master electricians, but excluding beginning electricians. Under the bill, beginning electricians are required to be registered but do not need to pass an examination. The bill requires that any person working as an electrician must be registered or licensed by Commerce, with certain exemptions. The bill also requires that no person may do electrical work unless a master electrician is at all times responsible for the work.

The bill specifies several persons who are exempt from licensing or registration, including individuals who perform certain types of electrical work on their own residences or in their own facilities, persons who perform electrical work on elevators and escalators, alarm systems, and plant and equipment used for carrying telecommunication services. Also exempt are employees and subcontractors of

electricity providers, persons who work on lighting or signals for public thoroughfares or airports, and persons who work on the utility side of substations and other distribution facilities owned or operated by customers or members of electricity providers.

In addition to the rules required to be promulgated by Commerce for all electricians, the bill imposes specific requirements as to the amount of experience necessary to be licensed as a residential or nonresidential journeyman electrician.

## **Electrical** inspections

Under current law, a municipality may enact an ordinance regulating electrical construction and the inspection of electrical construction if the ordinance meets the minimum state requirements. Under current law, Commerce is required to contract with a municipality for inspections of electrical wiring for compliance with state law if the municipality has enacted such an ordinance and if Commerce is requested to do so by the municipality. Commerce is also required to provide such inspection in a municipality that has not enacted such an ordinance. Also, Commerce may, at the request of the owner or tenant, inspect the exterior and interior wiring of a public building or place of employment to determine compliance with state law. Current law also requires the company furnishing electric current to obtain proof of compliance with state law before furnishing the current. The will require This bill changes these provisions by requiring that Commerce promulgate rules establishing standards and a process for the inspection of electrical wiring, including the inspection of electrical wiring for which a municipality does not provide inspection. The bill specifically prohibits municipalities from certifying electrical inspectors.

Mary,

As we discussed earlier this week, please add the mandatory electrical contractor licensing, with renewal on a 3-year cycle per my previous email message.

We also need to have a couple of other changes as well.

First, the grandfathering provisions included in the bill need to be removed by deleting Section 36.

Second, we need to have language added that gives all potential licensees (electricians and contractors) 36 months to comply with the licensing requirement. In other words, Commerce should have 2 years (which they do under the current language) to develop the program, and once the program is developed, anyone wanting to be an electrician or electrical contractor will have 3 years to obtain their license before they would be in violation of the law. Essentially, this law wouldn't be fully implemented for 5 years.

If you have questions on this last part, you might be best served to contact Beata Kalies at WFC as I just don't have the best understanding of how everything should fit together. Her phone number is 258-4406.
