Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the State Public Defender (SPD) provides indigent people legal representation for certain types of proceedings including criminal, protective placement, paternity, and juvenile delinquency commitment, proceedings. The SPD also provides children legal counsel in certain types of cases regardless of the child's economic status. The SPD must make indigency determinations with respect to persons who request appointment of counsel on the basis of indigency and must assign counsel for all people who are eligible for SPD representation. The SPD may assign cases to attorneys employed by the SPD or to private attorneys. The SPD reimburses private attorneys \$40 an hour for time spent related to a case, excluding travel time. (The SPD reimburses private attorneys \$25 an hour for out-of-county travel.)
